### How Am I Doing?

Every month or so, you may want to ask yourself the following questions. This is a way for you to check on how the troop is doing. It will help you in directing a well-rounded Girl Scout program.

- What activities have the girls tried? Are they exploring a variety of interest areas? (Girl Scout basics, leadership experiences, adventure activities, outdoor fun, healthy living, creative activities, explore and discover activities, family and friends, it's great to be a girl, etc.)
- What activities are you doing that help girls learn about people who are different from them?
- What have they like best? What have you liked best?
- Have you planned and carried out a service project?
- How much have the girls been involved with planning their activities?
- What opportunities have girls had for developing leadership skills? How are the girls getting along with each other? How do they welcome new girls? How do they relate to girls who are not part of the "group" or "clique"?
- How well are you relating to each individual girl?
- What kinds of growth have you noticed, either in yourself or in your girls?
- What can you try to do about the things that aren't going so well? Who can you contact for help?
- When will you re-evaluate how the troop is doing? Mark your calendar now to help you remember.
