Who We Serve

GSEIWI serves more than 18,000 girls ages 5-17 and nearly 5,000 adult volunteers in 31 counties in Eastern Iowa and seven counties in Western Illinois.

How We Serve Girls

Girl Scouts is a dynamic organization--adapting to girls' ever-changing needs. Girl Scout activities are age-appropriate and organized into six membership grade levels: Girl Scout Daisies (Kindergarten - Grade 1), Girl Scout Brownies (Grades 2-3), Girl Scout Juniors (Grade 4-5), Girl Scout Cadettes (Grades 6-8), Girl Scout Seniors (Grades 9-10), and Girl Scout Ambassadors (Grades 11-12).

When a girl joins Girl Scouts, she can choose any one, all, or some of the "pathways" to participate in within a single year: troop, events, camp, special interest groups, and travel. No matter which pathway a girl chooses, she is an actual Girl Scout.

GSEIWI provides girls with a rewarding leadership development experience through trained adult volunteers and members. Funding is provided in part by annual product sales programs, grants, local United Way agencies and generous donor contributions.
