Juliette Low World Friendship Fund

This program is designed to help girls think, share and learn about international friendships and the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS).

A few months after the death of Juliette Low in January 1927, the Juliette Low World Friendship Fund was created to honor her and her vision of worldwide friendships. The money collected by the fund is used to send Girl Scouts to other countries and to bring Girl Guides and Girl Scout from other countries to the USA. It also goes to the World Thinking Day Fund set up by the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) to promote the Girl Guide/Girl Scout movement throughout the world.

Complete at least six activities. It is helpful to begin activities by Juliette Low's birthday (October 31) and complete activities by World Thinking Day (February 22).

Discover:

1. Learn to say "hello", "please" and "thank you" in four languages.
2. Find out how children in different countries celebrate holidays or birthdays. Have a celebration with a foreign flavor. Include games, crafts, food, dance, etc.
3. Learn what the World Association trefoil symbolizes and use what you learn to design a ceremony.
4. Find the origin of your first and last name and the last names of your family and friends to learn their international roots.
5. Have a "tasting tea" of international goodies.

Connect:

1. Invite someone who has traveled to another country to talk to your troop about their experiences.
2. Learn about another country or another part of the USA through a pen pal.
3. Invite an international visitor to celebrate an "American" or Girl Scout holiday with your troop.
4. Participate in a World Thinking Day celebration.

Take Action:

1. Plan a series of international activities for another troop.
2. Learn a game from a foreign country and share it with other Girl Scouts or younger children.
3. Learn a new folk dance or song and share it with another troop.
